Together with Global Education Office(GEO) within CIE, we plan and offer 2 types of semester programs and various learning support services (systems) for international students.


Outbound: Takes care of SWU students who wish to apply and participate in our study abroad programs.




# INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS



#### Semester Program

SWU offers 2 types of non-degree semester programs for female undergraduate/graduate university students.

-Intensive Japanese Language Program
For those who wish to enhance Japanese language.

#### -SWU Academic Program

For those who wish to take liberal arts classes conducted in Japanese and experience actual Japanese university classes with other SWU students.

# SWU Summer International Program

A special summer program in English for international students. Consists of unique lectures and activities to learn many aspects of Japanese traditional and contemporary culture.

## Intensive Japanese Language Program



Students must be in an undergraduate or graduate program at a university outside Japan and are required to have studied basic Japanese to be enrolled in the program. (JLPT N3, JPT 430 or above, J-CAT 200 or above, or CEFR A2 level recommended)

#### Courses

Students are required to take 5 mandatory Japanese language courses worth 8 credits Students may also take up to 2 liberal arts courses of their choice, either in English or Japanese, depending on their language level. Note: Due to limitations on class size and required Japanese proficiency level, students may not be able to enroll in all the courses they choose.

#### Language Requirement

Must have studied basic Japanese:

JLPT N3 level, CEFR A2 level, JPT430 level or J-CAT200 level recommended before arrival

#### **Program Content**

Offers 7 Japanese language courses designed for the program participants. There is also an optional course to learn Japanese used in business scenes.

Each class will be divided into 2 levels according to the participants level range and number of students.

- Japanese Communication (90min class/twice a week)
- Japanese in Context (90min class/twice a week)
- Intermediate Grammar (90min class/twice a week)
- Intermediate Reading (90min class/once a week)
- Internship Preparation (90min class/once a week)

## **SWU Academic Program**



#### Program requirement

Students must be in an undergraduate or graduate program at a university outside Japan and must have altained the N2 level on the Japanese-Language Proficieny Test (JPT 525 or above, J-CAT 250 or above, J-CAT B1 or above).

#### Courses

Students are advised to register in at least 7 courses to maintain their visa status, and are allowed to take up to 10 courses of their choice. Students may choose from a variety of courses including several Japanese language courses that are open to international students. Students register for classes during orientation. Note: Due to limitations on class size and required Japanese proficiency level, students may not be able to enroll in all

#### Language Requirement

Must have attained JLPT N2 or have the score above: JPT525 level, J-CAT250 level or JLCAT B1 level

#### Program Content

- Students are advised to take some Japanese language courses offered to our degree-seeking international students. (Japanese coordinator will recommend which courses to take according to placement test results)
- Students may choose and take from the list of courses open to international students. (Courses are offered by our 14 undergraduate study areas)
- Students should take at least 7 courses up to 10 courses.
- Recommended courses for international students:
  - -<u>Understanding Japan (spring only):</u> omnibus course to study Japanese culture and society.
  - -<u>Comparative Education (fall only):</u> students research and present the education system of their home country and -<u>Crosscultural Communication</u>

#### **Visitor Sessions**

SWU invites guest lecturers from Japanese enterprises to present and share their history and career. This enables students to understand Japanese culture from a different perspective.

#### **Practical Classes**

Japanese language teachers designs and offers practical and hands-on classes for students to actually use and enhance their Japanese skills

#### **Accommodation Discount**

SWU offers 3 types of accommodation, both on campus and off campus.

To make the rents affordable for international students, SWU sets a special discount so the rents do not differ too much according to the type and location of the accommodation.





#### Hirao Scholarship

Our former Chancellor Koji Hirao founded a private scholarship for students who resides in South East Asia. This scholarship will financially support the students study abroad fee for Japan, and enables students to focus on studying, instead of taking time to earn money for the tuition at part-time jobs.


#### **PROGRAM PARTICIPANTS**

#### **Program Offering during COVID-19**

SWu acted promptly and speedy to help students travel to Japan after COVID-19 shock and before border restrictions.

After travel suspension, SWU offered semester program online instead of cancelling and postponing incoming exchange, and launched a new "one-on-one" language exchange program (LEPP) for SWU students and our partner university students.

#### APPLICATION PROCESS

#### **NOMINATION**

Email us the list of students you wish to send by the deadline:

**SPRING: November 15th** 

FALL: May 15th

#### **ORIENTATION**

Students are asked to take part in our placement test and orientation before the start of the semester.
Students should arrive to Japan

on the designated dates.



Students are asked to register an account and submit all necessary documents online by the deadline:

SPRING: November 25th FALL: May 25th

#### **ACCEPTANCE**

Once the student is officially accepted, CIE will issue a "Letter of Acceptance" and apply for the "Certificate of Eligibility(COE)" needed for visa issuance.

When the COE is issued, students should proceed to applying for their visa and prepare for departure.
